Directions to venues

Flagler Gym

Traveling north on Interstate 95: Take Exit 311 east (State Road 207) toward St. Augustine until it intersects with U.S. 1. Turn left on U.S. 1 (heading north) and then right on King Street. Follow King Street for ½ mile and take a right on to Grenada (just before the Lightner Museum). Flagler Gym is on the right, across from the museum.

Traveling south on Interstate 95: Take Exit 318 east (State Road 16) toward St. Augustine until it intersects with U.S. 1. Turn right on U.S. 1 (heading south) and then left on King Street. Follow King Street for ½ mile and take a right on to Grenada (just before the Lightner Museum). Flagler Gym is on the right, across from the museum.

Flagler Field Complex

Flagler Field's entrance is next to the Humane Society, behind K-Mart.

From I-95 take Exit 311 (State Road 207).

Take 207 East to SR 312. Make a right on SR 312. Go to second traffic light (Old Moultrie Road) and take a left. Flagler Field is approximately 1/2 mile on the left.

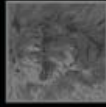
Directions to the Flagler Tennis Complex

Traveling north on Interstate 95: Take Exit 311 east (State Road 207) toward St. Augustine until it intersects with U.S. 1. Turn left on U.S. 1 (heading north) and then right on King Street. Follow King Street for ½ mile and take a left on Riberia (across from Lil' Champ Store). The Tennis Center will be the second street on your left (Valencia).

Traveling south on Interstate 95: Take Exit 318 east (State Road 16) toward St. Augustine until it intersects with U.S. 1. Turn right on U.S. 1 (heading south) and then take a left on to Maple Street (just before the St. Augustine Fire Department). Take your first left, Valencia, and the Tennis Center will be on your right (200 yards).

Visitor Centers

For more information on the area's attractions, call or visit the St. Johns County Visitor's and Convention Bureau office, the St. Augustine and St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce or the Visitor Information Centers in downtown St. Augustine or St. Augustine Beach. All have brochures and information on local attractions and events, and the St. Augustine center has several historical exhibits and an audio-visual program covering St. Augustine's history.

Bridge of Lions

Two Carrara marble lions sculptured in the likeness of the Loggia del Lanzi in Florence anchor the historic bridge between St. Augustine and The Beaches of Anastasia Island.

Casa Monica Hotel

Opened in January of 1888, the hotel was designed by Bostonian Franklin W. Smith, an amateur architect, and founder of the YMCA and contemporary of railroad pioneer Henry Flagler. The Casa Monica was sold by Smith to Flagler three months after its opening and renamed The Hotel Cordova. The hotel thrived for a number of years, but closed in 1932. In 1962, the structure was transformed into the St. Johns County Courthouse and county offices. A private company purchased the property in 1997 and after major restoration has reopened it as a 137-room luxury hotel, billing it as "the oldest hotel in the oldest city in the United States."

Castillo De San Marcos National Monument

Originally built by the Spanish in 1672-1695, the stone fortress was constructed with blocks of coquina. The shellrock was shipped from nearby Anastasia Island by barge. The impressive fortress withstood many attacks by the British and was never captured.

Catholic Basilica/Cathedral

This ornate Spanish structure was originally built in 1797.

City Gate

Originally, St. Augustine was surrounded by a defense wall to protect the Colonial settlement. Today, its ruins have been salvaged as an entry to the city. Part of the old barrier has been reconstructed on the green of Castillo de San Marcos.

Colonial Spanish Quarter

This is a living history museum of America's Spanish heritage. It includes restored and re-created homes and gardens in the small Spanish community where early settlers and soldiers lived before the American Revolution. Daily lifestyles of former occupants are re-enacted by guides and craftsmen dressed in period clothing.

Creative Studios: Glassblowing Studios and Gallery

Watch Master Glassblower Thomas Long create one-of-a-kind blown glass art in the Creative Studios hot shop, the only studio in Northeast Florida open to the public. The gallery at Creative Studios features art by Long and other American glass artists. Group demonstrations and tours are available by reservation.

Florida Heritage Museum

This museum features displays designed to spark the imagination. Visitors enter the Gilded Age of Henry M. Flagler as his story is told through unpublished photographs and artifacts.

Fort Matanzas National Monument

The watchtower of Fort Matanzas, on Rattlesnake Island, served as an outpost warning the city of approaching invaders. The original wood and thatch was replaced by the present stone tower in 1742 and was used until 1821. The area is now a national park with beaches, surf casting and a ferry service. Grounds open 8:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m.; Visitor Center 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.; Ferry service runs on the half hour 9:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

Fountain of Youth

Located in a 21-acre archaeological park, the fountain is on the site claimed to be the landing place of Ponce de Leon in 1513. Features the Explorers Discovery Guide, a planetarium and Indian burial grounds.

Government House Museum

This museum presents the history of St. Augustine from its founding to the beginning of this century through a variety of exhibits.

Huguenot Cemetery

When the yellow fever epidemic struck in 1821, the mostly Catholic city of St. Augustine had no place to bury Protestants. The City Council obtained a half-acre of land by federal approval for that purpose. The local Presbyterian congregation acquired the property in 1832. The name "Huguenot" probably refers to the members of the 1564 French expedition that established Fort Caroline, later Jacksonville.

J & S Carousel

This 1927 C.W. Parker Carousel has 20 horses and two chariots. Open daily 10 a.m. – 10 p.m. (will close at 9 p.m. during the school year).

Lightner Museum

The refurbished and restored building which houses the Lightner Museum was originally the 300-room Alcazar Hotel built by Henry Flagler in 1888. Otto C. Lightner, a Chicago publisher, bought the hotel in 1947 to hold his huge collection of Victorian-era memorabilia. The museum features collections of art, porcelain, Tiffany glass, 19th century musical instruments, needlework, furniture, dolls and more.

Lincolville Historic District

Once the site of plantations and orange groves, this historic St. Augustine area became a free slave settlement in 1866. The neighborhood contains Victorian-era homes and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Memorial Presbyterian Church

The church was built in 1889 by Henry Flagler as a memorial to his daughter. Flagler and several family members are buried here. The structure is a fine example of Venetian Renaissance architecture and features a 150-foot dome mirroring St. Marks Cathedral in Italy.

Mission of Nombre De Dios and Shrine of Our Lady of LaLeche

This is America's first mission and the site where the first mass was celebrated by Father Lopez de Mendoza Grajales in St. Augustine in 1565. The chapel is a functioning church of the diocese of St. Augustine. A 208-foot stainless steel cross marks the site of the city's founding.

Museum of Weapons and Early American History

This museum of weapons and items of early American history, such as a beaded and feathered Indian rifle used during General Custer's bloody battle and the piano of John Tyler, 10th President of the United States. The museum has one of the most extensive Civil War collections in the United States.

National Cemetery

Used as a burial ground since at least 1763, this is Florida's oldest national military cemetery. Used for fallen soldiers during the Second Seminole War (1835-1842), it is one of only 10 national cemeteries that display an illuminated flag, 24 hours a day. On the grounds of the Florida National Ground compound, immediately south of St. Francis Barracks.

Old Florida Museum

This hands-on living history museum chronicles the history of St. Augustine from pre-European times to 1845. Featured are three eras of Florida's history; pre-European, Timucuan Indian Spanish Colonial era and the "Florida Cracker" Pioneers era.

Old Jail

Originally the St. Johns County Jail, it was built in 1890-91 in Victorian Queen Anne style and remained in service until 1953. Now a National Historic Site, the building contains early American criminology exhibits, weapons and displays dealing with prison life.

Old St. Augustine Village Museum

An entire city block of history experience, Old St. Augustine Village is a collection of 10 authentic houses dating from 1790 and their centuries-old courtyards and gardens. Historic sites and archaeological ruins on the property date to 1572 and include a Spanish Colonial defense line, remnants of a 16th century hospital and cemetery, and the site of St. Augustine's earliest bridge. The Village features the historic houses, a museum store, a host pavilion, a visitor's center and 10 exhibition galleries on St. Augustine's and the nation's history. Inside Old St. Augustine Village, interpreters give history a voice and a story. The folksy 1899 Star General Store offers unusual merchandise with authentic atmosphere.

Oldest Drugstore Museum

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the store has been restored to the mid-1880's style.

Oldest House

The National Historic Landmark is also known as the Gonzales-Alvarez house. Believed to have been occupied continuously since 1727, the house features authentic décor portraying the lifestyles of its owners through three centuries. It is now owned and operated by the St. Augustine Historical Society.

Oldest Store Museum

This museum is a showcase of authentic memorabilia from the turn-of-the-century. More than 100,000 vintage items are on display, including high-wheeled bicycles, Gibson girl corsets, vehicles and more.

Oldest Wooden School House

The schoolhouse was built during the first Spanish occupation. The schoolmaster and his wife lived upstairs, above the small classroom. Related artifacts and copies of school books are exhibited.

Pena-Peck House

Home of the royal Spanish treasurer and Dr. Seth Peck family, this house is a St. Augustine original. It was built in the 1740s and constructed of stone, coquina and wood. It has been preserved and furnished and is now a home museum.

Potter's Wax Museum

More than 170 life-size, three-dimensional figures bring history alive at Potter's Wax Museum. These life-size wax figures of famous historical personalities are on permanent display, in authentic wardrobes and settings.

Ripley's Believe it or Not Museum

Robert L. Ripley called the "Modern Marco Polo," traveled all over the world to gather the items on display. Subjects range from unusual people and animals to bizarre inventions, puzzles and hobbies.

St. Augustine Alligator Farm and Zoological Park

The farm offers alligators and crocodiles at the world's original alligator attraction, plus monkeys, deer and exotic birds. Established in 1893 and at its current site since 1922, this attraction gives visitors a close-up glimpse of alligators feeding and sunbathing, plus Florida wildlife shows. The farm features all 22 species of the world's crocodylians.

The attraction is in the National Register of Historic Places.

St. Augustine Lighthouse & Museum

Visitors can climb the 219 steps to the top of the 1874 lighthouse for a panoramic view of the city and tour the museum housed in the restored keepers dwelling. Exhibits, a period room and a video theater tell the story of the light keepers and the lights they tended.

St. Augustine Visitor Center Theater

The theater in the Visitor Information Center features a film about the founding of St. Augustine and life in the city in 1576.

St. Johns Greyhound Park

Greyhound racing track features a restaurant and open-air grandstand.

St. Photios Shrine

This is the first national shrine of the Greek Orthodox Church in North America. The chapel commemorates the first colony of Greeks to arrive in North America in 1768.

San Sebastian Winery

This St. Augustine winery offers tours and tastings. It also has a wine/gift shop and a picnic area.

Spanish Military Hospital

Guided tours show Spanish military hospital life of 1791 and treatment provided soldiers.

Trinity Episcopal Church

The cypress shingle spire of this historic St. Augustine church remains unchanged since 1825. This church marks the beginning of Protestantism in Florida.

A National Historic Place, the house was built of coquina around 1797 by Andre Ximenez, a Spanish merchant.
